Abstract: In the fall of 2007 we combined all of our (approximately) 28-per-section classes of Beginning Spanish into two mega-sections of 220 students each. We will briefly discuss the reasons, theory, process and results of that decision. We will then take an in-depth look at the many day-to-day strategies we employ to facilitate student learning, maintain instructor/student and student/student interaction, prevent honor code violations, keep students engaged and on task, and prevent professor burn out.
