


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### Baroque Architecture





- 1600-1760
- Started in France with the Château de Maisons by François Mansart
- Special attention to light, color, and shade
- Intensity
- Linked to the Counter-Reformation by the Catholic Church
- Statement of the Church's power and wealth
- Incorporated Corps de Logis



## Baroque Music

- Ornamentation is key
- Use of Ground Bass
- Development of Diatomic Tonality
- Began after the Renaissance Period
- Courante- French dance using triple meter
- Use of Polyphony and Counterpoint
- New Instrumental Playing Techniques
- Enlarged range, size, and complexity of instruments used

## 18th Century Rococo







- Paintings: Curving forms and delicate, soft, and pale colors, trend of impurity among upper class signifying the rift between the church/Baroque period
- Sculptures: fragile porcelain (instead of marble), lighthearted
- Interior Design: carved wood, stucco, whimsical



#### Rococo Music- The Galante Style



- Developed from Baroque Music and came between the Baroque and Classical Periods
- Still had ornamentation, but extremely defined and with an intimate theme
- Melody-driven
- Freshness, Accessibility, and Charm
- Considered "city music" instead of "court music"
- Lighter, Cleaner Tonality
- A transparent accompaniment to a clear leading voice



## 19th Century Impresionism

- Studied the effects of light and color on different scenes
- Unfinished Quality
- Capturing the moment- scenes from everyday life
- Light-hearted
- Swirls of color and mixing on the canvas











## Impressionist Music


- Mainstream Popularity- 1890-1940
- Shorter forms of songspreludes, nocturne, and arabesque
- Use of uncommon scales and Major 7<sup>th</sup> Chords, extension of chord structures in 3rds to 5 and 6 part harmonies
- Driven by suggestion and atmosphere instead of emotion or story-telling
- The sounds reflect peaceful scenes such as moonlight, sunsets, and rivers
- Reaction to the 19<sup>th</sup> Century Romantic Era
