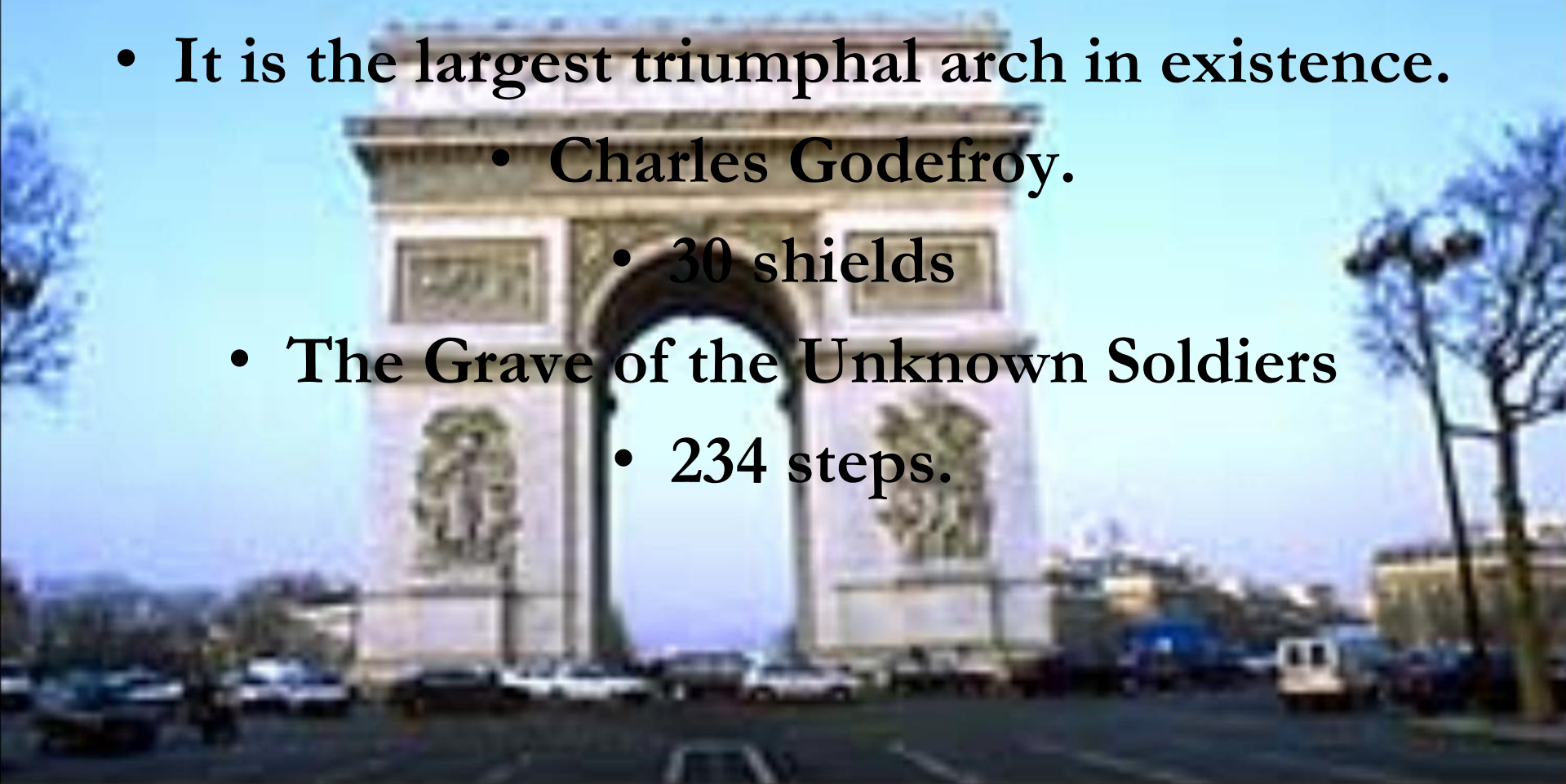

Arc de Triomphe

- Designed by Jean Chalgrin in 1806
- It is the largest triumphal arch in existence.
 - Charles Godefroy.
 - 30 shields
- The Grave of the Unknown Soldiers
 - 234 steps.

The Eiffel Tower



- Universal exhibition in celebration of the French revolution
 - Finished March 31, 1889
- It weighs 10,100 tons and is 324 m tall
 - 1665 steps
 - Gustave Eiffel
 - Tallest building in France
- Most visited paid monument in the world

 - The Glass Pyramid entrance

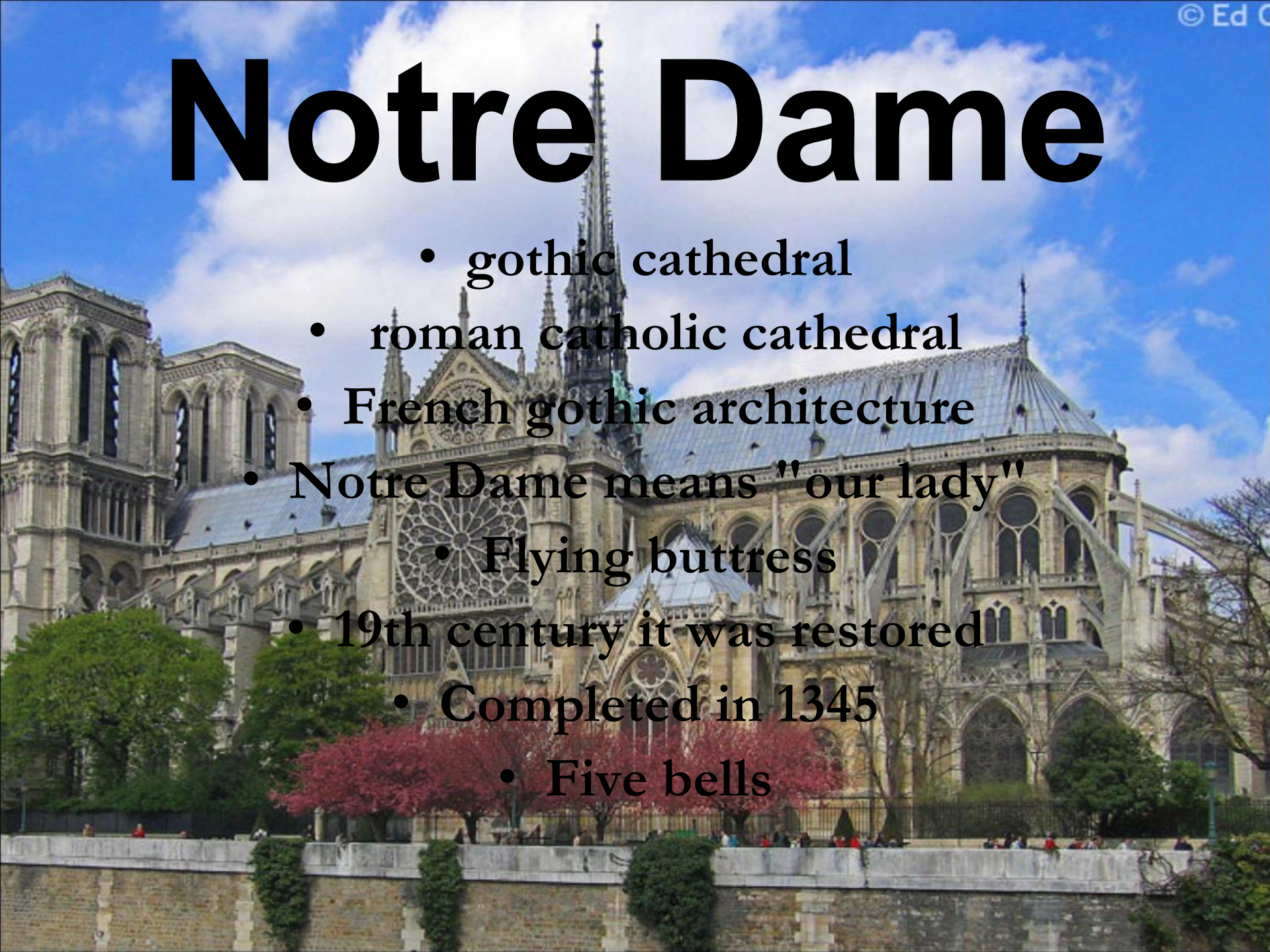

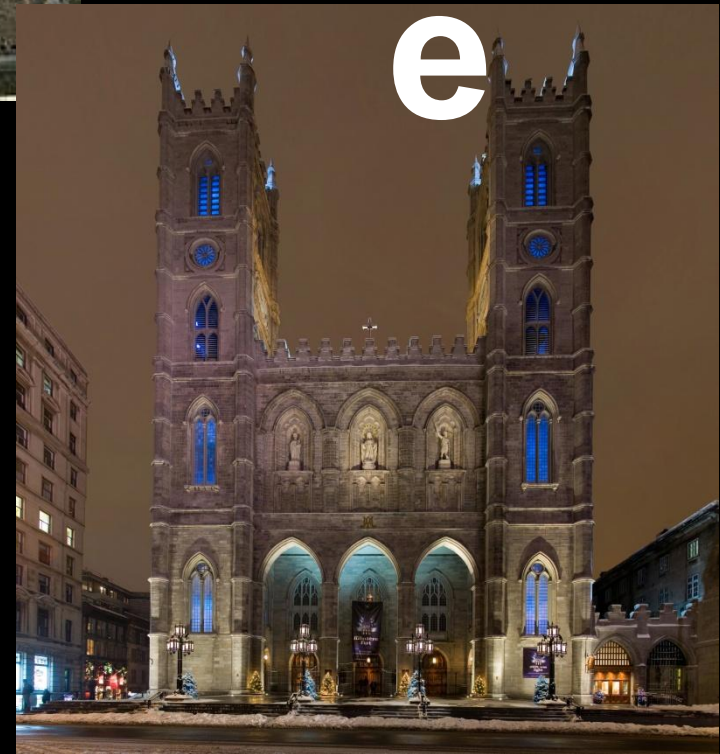
Notre Dame

 - Five bells

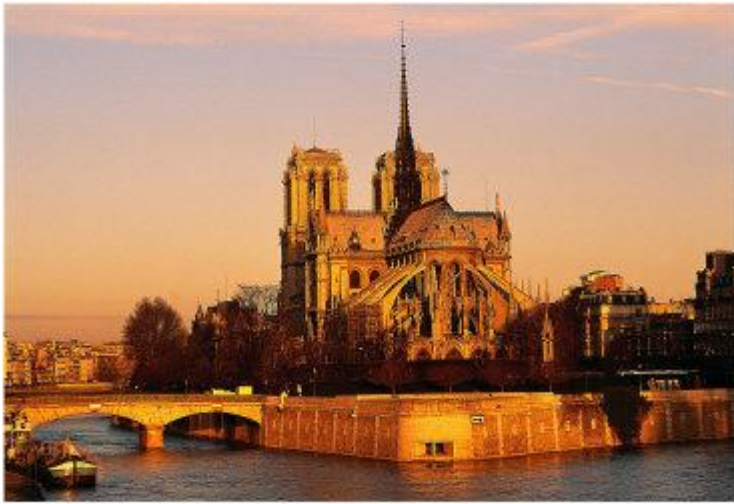

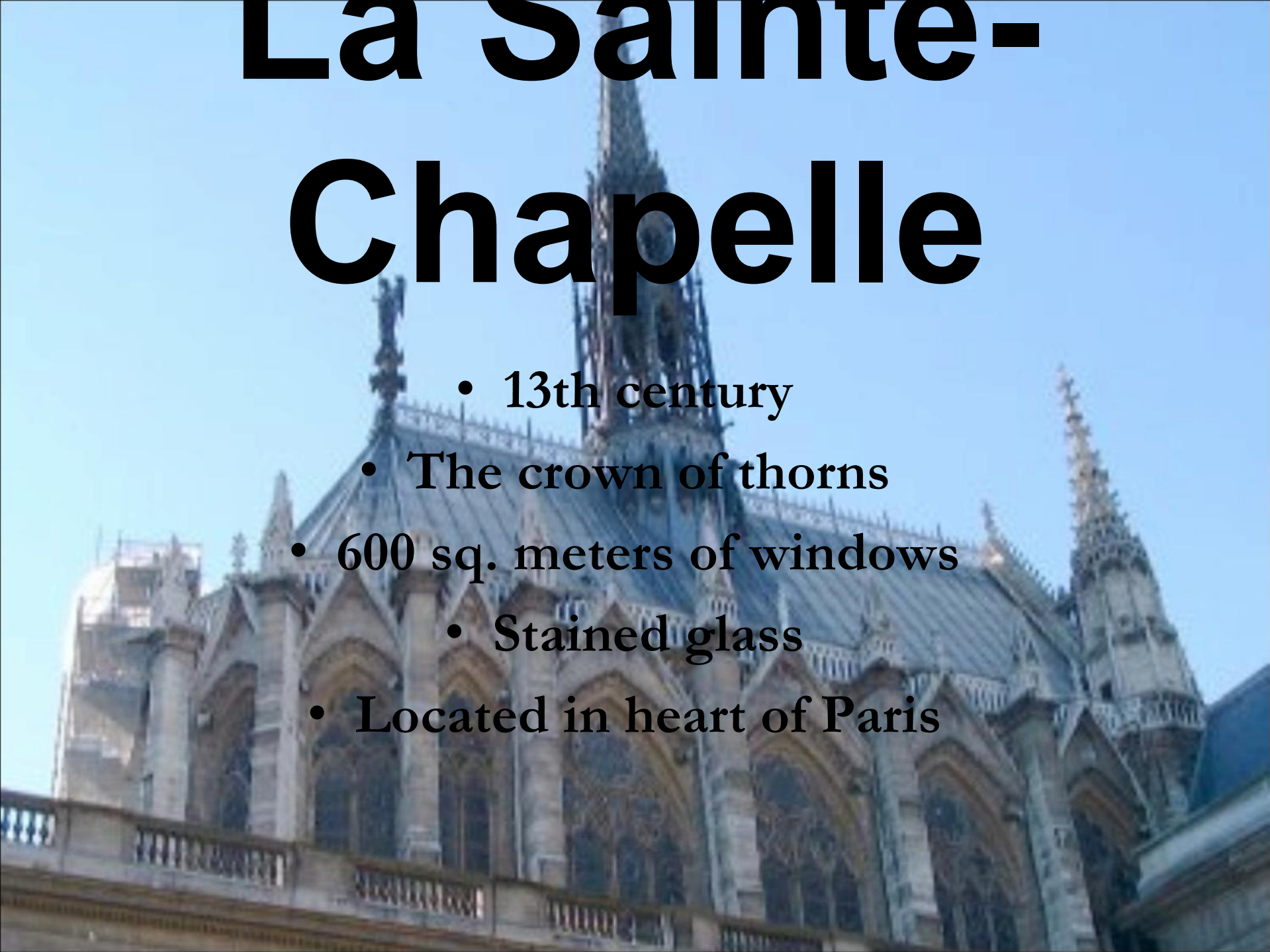
- Latin quarter in Paris

 - Finished in 1789



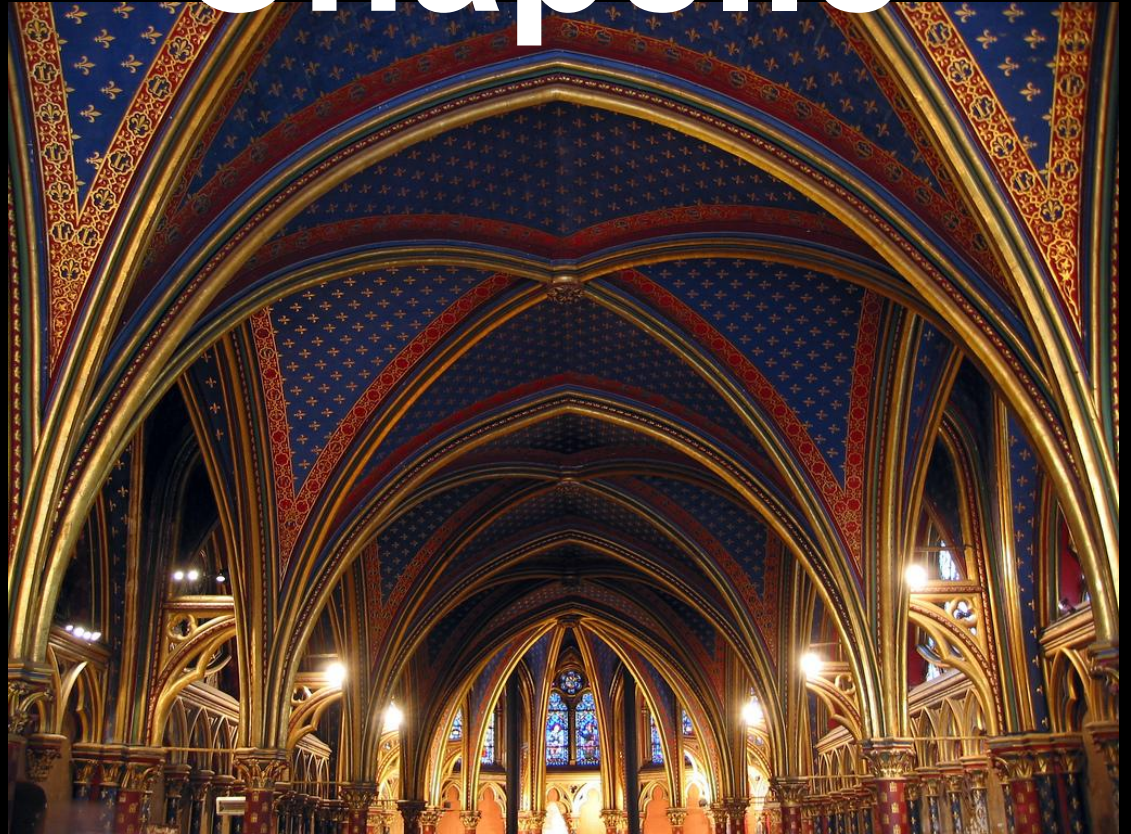
Le Pantheon

- Romano-Byzantine feature
 - Completed in 1914
 - travertine stone

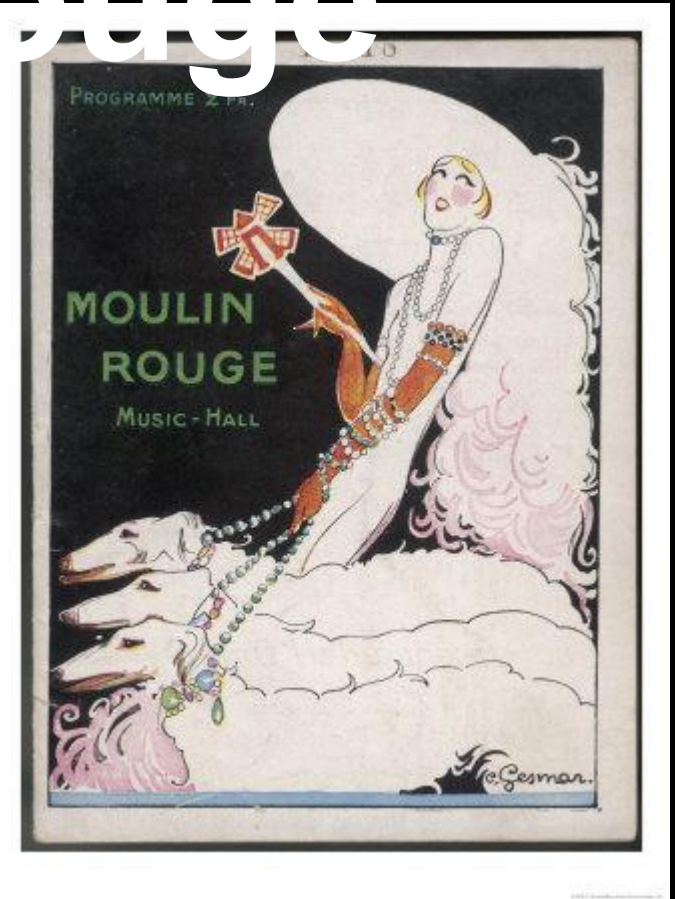
Moulin

- one of the largest theatres in the world





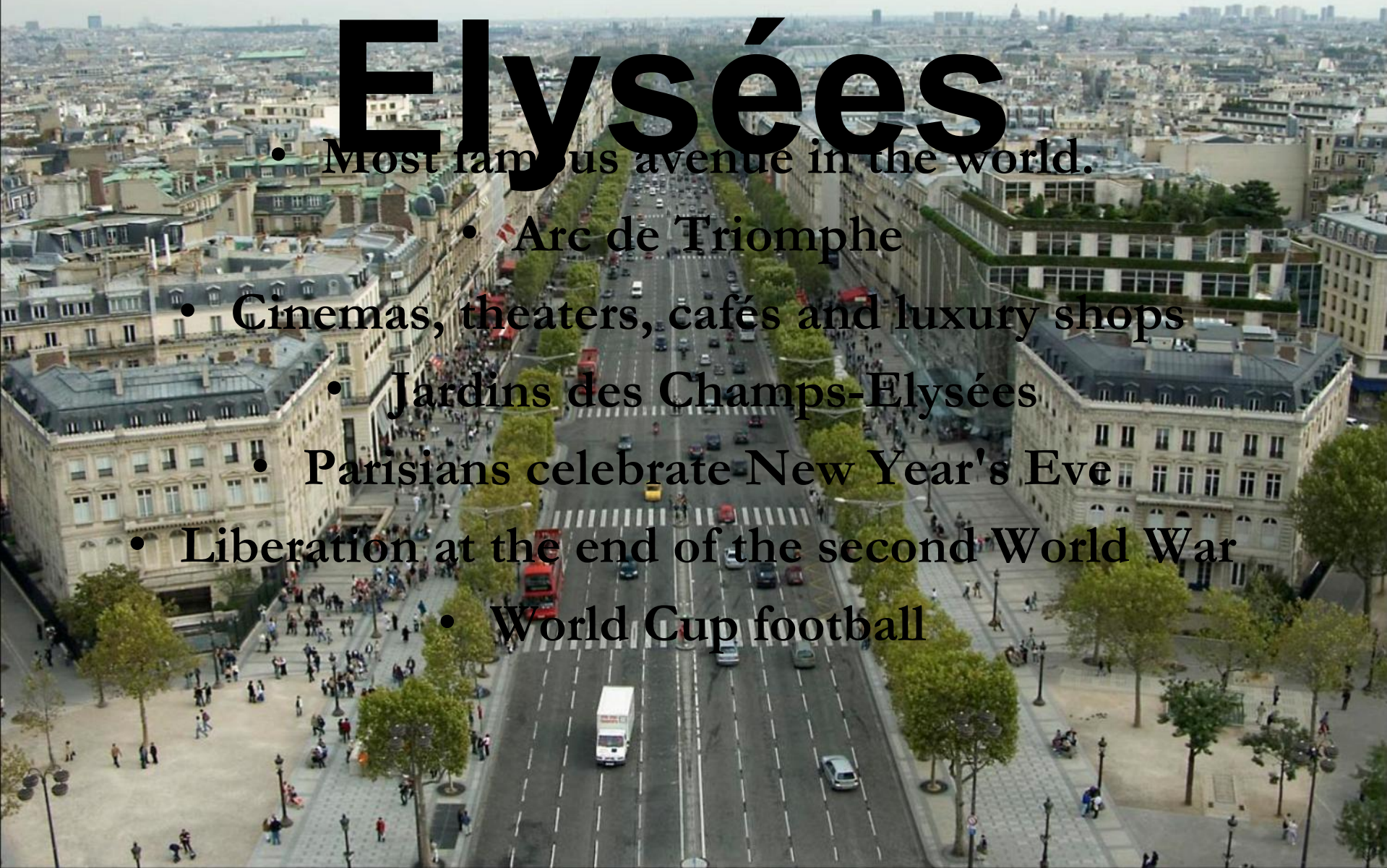
