Earn 3 undergraduate or graduate credits with the course: FL 216 “Art & Society in France” [Fulfills the CHASS Arts & Letters and University Visual & Performing Arts requirements]. The syllabus and travel itinerary are integrated, with classroom discussions complemented by site visits to historic burgundian towns, typical parisian neighborhoods, wine cellars, world-class art museums, restaurants, open-air markets, and more! No knowledge of French is required (all classes and tours are conducted in English), and there will be plenty of time to explore on your own as well.

Short and Sweet

This program is perfect for those whose schedules will not allow them to travel for more than two weeks. Cost is \$3,000 which includes: program fee, insurance, tuition, lodging, breakfasts, and six group meals; [not included: airfare, other meals, and personal expenses].
